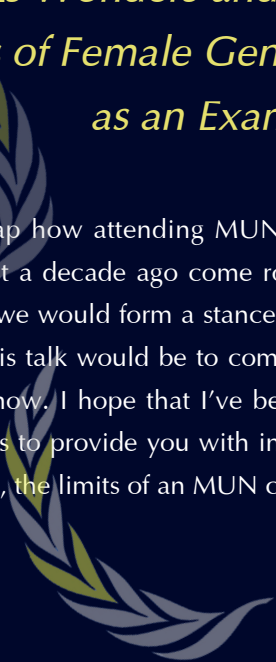


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Topic of Keynote Speech

Introduction of Special Rules of Procedure – UN4MUN



UN4MUN is a new procedure designed by the United Nations Department of Public Information (UNDPI) specially for Model UN conferences. The procedure's most significant feature is that it creates a new way of discussing and debating which more accurately mirrors actual UN meetings.

In UN4MUN Procedure, the process of “voting”, during which nations may hold different stances towards the issue, is not encouraged; instead, the procedure strongly calls for the establishment of consensus between every Member State. During the debate, all delegates work together to propose an elaborate resolution which will then be debated on twice to ensure its feasibility and legitimacy. Aside from the opening speeches, there are no other formal speeches in UN4MUN ROP. During debate, delegates are given the opportunities to “object” a clause by standing up to present their suggestions. Multiple delegates can be standing up and conversing directly at the

same time. Objections (or “Amendments”) are raised by delegates using “Add”, “Delete”, “Replace”, “Alter”, or “Retain” to amend a clause in the hopes of making it fit every nation’s interests. A resolution is considered passed if it is agreed upon by all delegates after the second round of debate. Therefore, delegates get to reach consensus on the final resolution.

In this year’s conference, UN4MUN Procedure will be adopted in our special committee, UN Women, for one important reason—we believe that during discussions involving human rights, or more specifically, women’s rights, not a single individual should be undermined or neglected. Through the unique consensus-reaching mechanism in UN4MUN Procedure, we hope that, at the end of the debate, the resulting resolution is one that is unanimously agreed upon by all parties concerned, and neglects no one in any way.
